The difference is just that these new sets use LED backlights rather than the fluorescent-type backlights used in most LCD TVs. There are currently two main ways that LED backlighting is applied. One type of LED backlighting is referred to as Edge Lighting. In this method, a series LED backlights are placed along the outside edges of the screen. The light is then dispersed across the screen. The other type of LED backlighting is referred to as Full-Array (also referred to sometimes as Full LED or Direct Lit LED). In this method, several rows of LEDs are placed behind the entire surface of the screen.</p> <p>The new LED TV sets offer the following things: 1. Lower power consumption. 2. No Mercury used as in some other LCD backlight systems. 3. More balanced color saturation.</p>	04
